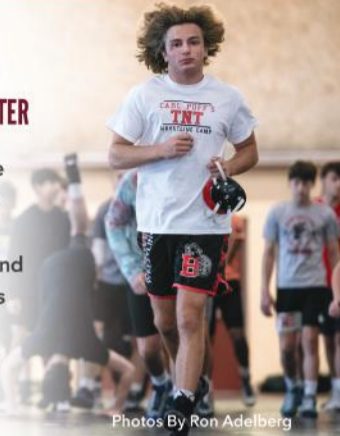

WHO'S AT THIS CAMP

CARL POFF CAMP DIRECTOR

Poff's tenure at Lock Haven University spanned twelve seasons. As head coach of the LHU wrestling team, Poff took the program to new heights. The winningest wrestling coach in school history, Poff teams went 167-62-3 and amassed a winning percentage of .726. His 1996-97 team finished fifth at the NCAA Division I Championship - the highest finish in school history - led by five individual All-American performances. His coaching yielded 80 National qualifiers, 14 All-Americans, two individual National Champions, 20 EWL Champions and 30 PSAC Champions. He was named PSAC Coach of the Year six times and on two occasions was the EWL Coach of the Year. Poff has coached both male and female wrestlers that went on to represent the United States at Olympic and World levels. He has been instrumental in developing wrestlers of all ages for the past forty years.

ROB FISHER CAMP DIRECTOR

Over the past 21 years, Coach Fisher has amassed a dual meet record of 219-102-2 as the head coach at Kutztown University. His wrestlers have earned 25 All-American honors and have won five individual National Championships. Fisher, a three-time KU Coach of the Year, led his 2019 team to the most successful season in school history. The Golden Bears finished the dual season with a 14-1 record, placed second in their NCAA Super Region and crowned three champions. KU had four National Qualifiers and placed tenth at the NCAA Championship crowning three All-Americans along with a National Champion. The Golden Bears have had at least one All-American in each of the last 11 seasons. KU has become one of the premier Division II programs in the country.

WOMEN'S CAMP

DIRECTOR: EMMA RANDALL, THE NEW YORK CITY REGIONAL TRAINING CENTER AND COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY CLUB WOMEN'S HEAD WRESTLING COACH

The camp will be directed by Emma Randall. Randall is the Head Women's Wrestling Coach at the New York City Regional Training Center and Columbia University Women's Club. She previously served as the head girls coach and program director for Beat the Streets NYC from 2018-2021. She was a member of USA Wrestling's National coaching staff from 2012-2018. Emma has been coach of numerous world teams at all age levels including the 2016 Olympics in Rio de Janeiro. In 2016, Randall earned her USA Wrestling Gold level coaching certification. She is one of less than 80 coaches to hold that certification and the only woman.

FEATURING: TERRY STEINER, USA WRESTLING'S NATIONAL WOMEN'S HEAD COACH

Terry Steiner was named USA Wrestling's National Women's Freestyle coach in 2002. In 2004, Steiner led the first U.S. Women's Freestyle Olympic team in history to one silver and one bronze medal. Steiner and the U.S. added bronze medals at the 2008 Beijing Games and the 2012 London Games. In 2016, he coached Helen Maroulis to the first Olympic gold medal in U.S. Women's Freestyle History. At the 2020 Tokyo Olympics he led the squad to an historic showing with a gold medal from Tamyra Mensah Stock, a silver medal from Adeline Gray, and bronze medals from Sarah Hildebrandt and Helen Maroulis.

Under his guidance, the U.S. Women boasts 54 World medals, including 15 golds, 13 silvers, and 26 bronzes. This past year at the 2021 World Championships the U.S. women brought home two silver and three bronze medals.

FEATURING: BRAZEL MARQUEZ, WYOMING SEMINARY GIRL'S ASSISTANT COACH

Originally from Los Angeles, California, Brazel Marquez is a three-time National Champion and has been on Cadet World and Pan American Teams. Marquez was a three-time California State Champion. She has twenty plus years experience wrestling nationally and internationally for California and USA Wrestling. Marquez is currently an assistant coach for the girls wrestling program at Wyoming Seminary.

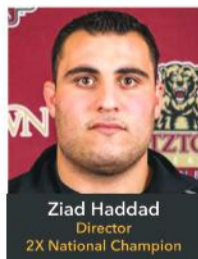
UPPER WEIGHT CAMP

DIRECTOR: ZIAD HADDAD • COUNSELOR: ANDREW DUNN

The camp will be under the direction of Ziad Haddad. In three years as a Kutztown wrestler, Haddad achieved nearly every possible award and honor. In 2015 he became KU's second two-time NCAA Champion, recorded his second consecutive undefeated season and became KU's second three-time All American. This past fall Haddad was inducted into KU's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Andrew Dunn will once again be assisting our upper weight camp. Dunn's credentials are outstanding and includes a high school state championship and a NCAA National Championship. In March he will be pursuing his second National title representing Kutztown University.

- For those athletes weighing 195 lbs. and above.
- Upper weight athletes attending with their team will automatically be assigned to this camp for all technique sessions.
- Any upper weight camper attending on his own will be assigned to a team for competition and will reap the benefits of this specialty camp.

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REGISTRATION & CHECKOUT

Registration will take place on Sunday, July 24th from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Keystone Fieldhouse. Coaches/wrestlers must submit their camper roommate request prior to the start of camp. Check out will take place on Wednesday, July 27th from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the residence hall. All campers must check out by 1:00 p.m. on that day. Transportation arrangements should be made accordingly.

ATHLETIC EVENT RELEASE & HEALTH FORMS

The camp has two required forms that must be signed by both the parent and participant prior to camp. **Any camper failing to submit these form will be unable to participate in the camp.**

HOUSING AND MEALS

Resident campers are housed in the University's **air-conditioned** residence halls with supervision at all times. A fully trained and dependable staff will monitor all residence halls for the duration of camp. All camp meals will be eaten in the South Dining Hall, located within walking distance from the residence hall and Keystone Hall. Resident campers will receive breakfast, lunch, and dinner daily. Commuting campers will receive lunch and dinner only. The first meal served will be dinner on Sunday, and the last meal served will be lunch on Wednesday.
